What we are trying to show is that while some definitions can add value to our lives, we are bigger than the labels and definitions we are given.

Each word is accompanied by its original Oxford English Dictionary definition. As you can see, some have limited relevance to their meaning today but the majority's meanings have been distorted and are completely unrelated.

This year's festival is about asking the hard questions, looking for the real answers and showing what really matters.

Each event throughout this year's program is an experience, a journey to work out why we're there, and what helped us get there along the way.

What we want to enable people to do is to see beyond the label, to see and know the person the behind the definition they've been given.
